### RESOLUTION NO. 01-88

A RESOLUTION TO CALL A SPECIAL COUNTY LEVY LIMIT OVERRIDE ELECTION TO BE HELD IN AND FOR NAVAJO COUNTY, ARIZONA.

WHEREAS, the Navajo County Board of Supervisors desires to submit a question to the qualified electors of Navajo County concerning the levy of a secondary property tax; and

WHEREAS, the Navajo County Board of Supervisors wishes to give the qualified electors of Navajo County a full opportunity to participate in this election;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE NAVAJO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, NAVAJO COUNTY, ARIZONA, that:

Section 1. A special County Levy Limit Override election shall be held in and for Navajo County, May 17, 1988, pursuant to A.R.S. 42-301.03 to submit to the qualified electors of Navajo County the question of the imposition of a new secondary property tax for General Fund purposes.


Section 2. The maximum amount of secondary property taxes levied shall not exceed \$1,995,000 in any year.

Section 3. Duration of the secondary property tax shall be seven years, effective fiscal year 1988/89 through fiscal year 1994/95.


Section 4. The estimated secondary property tax rate needed to raise \$1,995,000 in fiscal year 1988/89 is \$.38 per \$100.00 assessed valuation.

Section 5. The Board of Supervisors desires public participation and will publish a publicity pamphlet including PRO and CON statements. Citizen statements for or against the question must be received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors no later than March 25, 1988, and shall be limited to 200 words in length.
