

IDENTIFICATION OF COMMUNITY NEEDS

RESOLUTION NO. 66-90

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NAVAJO IDENTIFYING FY 1990/91 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING NEEDS AND ACTIVITIES TO BE UNDERTAKEN TO MEET SUCH NEEDS.

WHEREAS, Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, states that the primary objective of the Title and of the community development program of each grantee is the "development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income..."; and

WHEREAS, Section 106(d)(2)(D) requires the Governor of each state to certify that each unit of general local government to be distributed funds will identify its community development and housing needs, including the needs of low and moderate income persons, and the activities to be undertaken to meet such needs.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Supervisors of the County of Navajo hereby state that the community development and housing needs of the County of Navajo including the needs of low and moderate income persons are:

- Health and Welfare Center, located in southern portion of the County.
- Housing Rehabilitation Program.
- Computer Hardware and Software for Heber/Overgaard Senior Citizens.
- Remodeling of Pinetop/Lakeside Senior Citizen Center.
- Show Low Nutrition Center (Kitchen Facility).
- Various Road Projects in County.
- Cedar Hills Community Center, Expansion and/or Remodel.
- Infrastructure for Economic Development.
- Landfill Development.
- Capital Improvements to White Mountain Humane Society.
- Food Assistance/Emergency Housing.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Board of Supervisors of the County of Navajo hereby state that the activities proposed to be undertaken with FY 90/91 CDBG funds are:

To propose applications to the Northern Arizona Council of Governments requesting \$281,508 for the acquisition of land and construction of facilities in the southern part of Navajo County, free of architectural barriers, to provide public welfare and health services to low and moderate income people; and will request as a backup application \$281,508 for a housing rehabilitation program to rehab approximately 29 homes to benefit approximately 110 low and moderate income people who own their home. The funds would be used to rehab homes of those people who qualify and whose homes are in a deteriorating or deteriorated condition; and will submit a second back-up application for services to the elderly in Navajo County with the funds programmed through the Senior Centers.

In addition, the County will submit an application to the Department of Commerce State Special Projects account for \$200,000 for a Housing Rehabilitation Program to rehab approximately 55 homes to benefit approximately 226 low to moderate income persons.
