

RESOLUTION NO. 09-94

**RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AUTHORIZING THE PRELIMINARY STEPS TO BE TAKEN TO BECOME A PARTICIPATING EMPLOYER IN THE PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL RETIREMENT SYSTEM ON BEHALF OF THE FULL-TIME, PAID NAVAJO COUNTY ATTORNEY INVESTIGATOR WHO IS A CERTIFIED PEACE OFFICER REGULARLY ASSIGNED TO HAZARDOUS DUTY.**

WHEREAS, the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System has been created by the State of Arizona in order to provide a uniform, consistent and equitable state-wide program for public safety personnel who are regularly assigned to hazardous duty; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of said Public Safety Personnel Retirement System, it is optional for a political subdivision to include within said system its full-time, paid county attorney investigators who are certified peace officers regularly assigned to hazardous duty; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the best interest of Navajo County to include its full-time, paid county attorney investigator who is a certified peace officer regularly assigned to hazardous duty under the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System Act as set forth in Title 38, Chapter 5, Article 4, Arizona Revised Statutes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By the Navajo County Board of Supervisors as follows:

1. It is hereby authorized and requested that a preliminary actuarial survey be made to determine the estimated cost of participation, the benefits to be derived, and such other information as may be deemed appropriate, the cost of said survey to be paid by Navajo County.
2. The County Manager is hereby authorized to provide and turn over such records as are necessary to make the actuarial survey.
3. The County Manager and Board of Supervisors are authorized to take whatever steps that are necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution.
4. The County Manager shall file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Fund Manager of the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System.

### RESOLUTION NO. 10-94

**FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION  
A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
OF NAVAJO COUNTY ADOPTING A FAIR HOUSING POLICY.  
MAKING KNOWN ITS COMMITMENT TO THE PRINCIPLE  
OF FAIR HOUSING, AND DESCRIBING ACTIONS IT SHALL  
UNDERTAKE TO AFFIRMATIVELY FURTHER FAIR HOUSING**

*WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, requires that all applicants for Community Development Block Grant funds certify that they shall affirmatively further fair housing; and*

*WHEREAS, the Civil Rights Act of 1968 ( Commonly know as the Federal Fair Housing Act) and the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988, declare a national policy to prohibit discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing and financing of housing or land to be used for the construction of housing or in the provision of brokerage services, on the basis of: race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin; and*

*WHEREAS, fairness is the foundation of the American system and reflects traditional American values; and*


*WHEREAS, discriminatory housing practices undermine the strength and vitality of America and its people.*

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Board of Supervisors of Navajo County hereby wish all persons living, working, doing business in or traveling through this County to know that:


- 1. Discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing and financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services, on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin is prohibited by law; and*
- 2. That it is the policy of the County to implement programs, within the constraints of its resources, to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin; and*
- 3. Within available resources, Navajo County will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against in housing issues on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin to seek equity under existing federal or state laws and to file a complaint with the Civil Rights Division of the Arizona Attorney General's Office or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and*

4. That Navajo County shall publicize this Resolution and thereby encourage owners of rental properties, developers, builders and others involved with housing to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Act and the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances; and
5. That Navajo County shall undertake the following additional actions to "affirmatively further fair housing";
  - a. mail this Resolution to the selected entities in the real estate, banking, development communities; and
  - b. mail this Resolution to selected community organizations; and
  - c. mail this Resolution to radio stations and newspapers in Navajo County; and
  - d. post copies of this Resolution in the various locations throughout the County; and
  - e. distribute "Fair Housing: Your Rights and Responsibilities" brochure in both English and Spanish; and
  - f. make available for public review the "Tenant's Rights Handbook".


1983	\$117,750 for Senior Citizens Center Facilities
1984	\$152,000 for Senior Citizens Center Facilities
1987	\$160,000 for Health and Welfare Facilities
1991	\$287,781 for Health and Welfare Facilities
1991	\$200,000 for Housing Rehabilitation
1992	\$ 75,000 for Housing Rehabilitation

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### FAIR HOUSING PROCLAMATION




